

Sports Premium funding report

The government is providing funding of over 3150 million per annum for academic years 2013-2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding –provided jointly by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – will be allocated to primary school headteachers. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and Sport in schools.

Funding for schools will be calculated by reference to the number of primary aged pupils (between ages of 5-11) as recorded in the annual schools census. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

In spending the funding we take into account the following factors;

- The increase in participation rates in such activities as games, dance, gymnastics, swimming and athletics
- The increase and success in competitive school sports
- How much more inclusive the physical education curriculum has become
- The growth in the range of traditional and alternative sporting activities
- The improvement in partnership work on physical education with other schools and other local partners
- Links with other subjects that contribute to pupils' overall achievement and their greater social, spiritual, moral and cultural skills
- The greater awareness amongst pupils about the dangers of obesity, smoking and other such activities that undermine pupils' health
